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Australians put their trust Members Health insurance funds


Results of a new independent survey of more than 12,500 customers of Members Health funds has revealed trust in not-for-profit and member owned health insurers exceeds that of some of Australia's biggest household-name brands.

Matthew Koce, CEO of Members Health, described the results of the Discovery Research survey as, a huge vote of confidence in the people-first culture shared by his not for profit and member owned community of funds.

"Members Health funds achieved an average trust score among their policyholders of almost 84 per cent – far above Australia Post on 69.7 per cent and Telstra on 58.5 per cent."
